The English Tree Action Plan (ETAP)

- The England Trees Action Plan (ETAP) sets out our long-term vision for the sector, and the steps we will take over this parliament to start the journey to that vision.
- The strategic framework of the ETAP will deliver a number of Government ambitions. It will:
- Provide an ambitious, long term vision for trees and woodland in England to 2050 and beyond
- Outline Government's plans to deliver the trees aspects of the Nature for Climate Fund and other funding streams
- Act as a call to action to land-owners and managers, the third sector, and communities to help us meet these ambitions
- Align with other policy areas including peat and nature

The Structure of the England Trees Action Plan

- Long Term vision to 2050 and beyond The England Trees Action Plan sets out Government's long-term, generational vision for the sector and England's treescape: what it needs to deliver and how Government will help others deliver it.
- There are FIVE chapters outlining over 80 policy actions Government will take during this Parliament to help meet the long term vision.

These chapters are:

- 1. Expanding and connecting our trees and woodlands
- 2. Trees and Woodlands as part of the green economy
- 3. Protecting and improving our trees and woodlands
- 4. Connecting people with trees and woodlands
- 5. Knowledge and science for trees and woodlands

Trees and Woodland as Part of the Green Economy

Supporting innovative approaches to forestry

- Support for agroforestry
- Encourage recreation and tourism in woodlands

Support for tenant farmers

· More clarity on woodland creation on tenanted land

encouraging the use of timber in construction

- Provision of a timber innovation fund
- Develop a roadmap on use of timber in construction with key industry stakeholders
- Promoting more use of modern methods of construction

Greening finance and taxation to support woodland creation

- Launch an Impact Fund to stimulate the flow of private finance into trees and woodland
- Develop natural capital markets
- Clarity on tax treatment of woodlands

Building a bigger, skilled workforce

- Understand the workforce needs of the sector, including in support of nature and economic benefits
- Improve skills & training routes into the forestry & arboriculture sector

Agroforestry and the English Woodland Creation Offer (EWCO)

- We will provide financial support for agroforestry through the newly created English Woodland Creation Offer (EWCO):
- Phase 1 will be launched soon and will include support for Shelterbelts – the minimum eligible width will be reduced to 10m from the usual 20m to allow this.
- Phase 2 will be launched early next year and we are working through what other forms of AF that will be eligible for support in it.
- We will ensure that a there is a smooth transition EWCO to any of the governments future environmental land management schemes.


The Test and Trial will test how the adoption of agroforestry can be encouraged within the ELM schemes through Advice and Guidance and different Payment Incentives by working with regional groups of farmers, land managers, advisors and NGO's.

Defra Agroforestry and Environmental Land Management Schemes

- We will include support for tree planting, woodland creation and management, and agroforestry across our new Sustainable Farming Incentive, Local Nature Recovery scheme and Landscape Recovery scheme.


